The PCC Task Group on Developing Guidelines for Using ISO 639-3 Language Codes for Library Cataloging is charged to: develop a set of guidelines for when and how to use ISO 639-3 language codes in library cataloging by revising and expanding the guidelines developed for the BABEL test (<https://www.loc.gov/aba/pcc/taskgroup/BABEL-test-MARC-guidelines.pdf>). The guidelines should address the following topics.

- Where to find the codes
- Coding of
 - Macrolanguages
 - Historical languages
 - Standard languages
- Situations where the cataloger is unable to identify the language with the precision required by ISO 639-3
- Coding so that records are usable both in systems that support the use of ISO 639-3 and those that don't
