

Name and Names H 1919

BACKGROUND: *The subdivisions -Name and -Names are free-floating under certain types of headings. This instruction sheet provides guidelines for assigning these subdivisions.*

1. -Name. Assign the free-floating subdivision **-Name** under names of *individual* persons, deities, places, corporate bodies, Christian denominations, wars, events, and ethnic groups for works on the origin, history, spelling, etc., of the name of the person, place, etc. *Examples:*

Title: The formation of Catalonia.
651 #0 \$a Catalonia (Spain) \$x Name.

Title: The name above every name.
600 00 \$a Jesus Christ \$x Name.

Title: Name of the American war of 1861-1865.
650 #0 \$a United States \$x History \$y Civil War, 1861-1865
\$x Name.

2. -Names.

a. General. Assign the free-floating subdivision **-Names** under *types* of objects, animals, events, organizations, educational institutions, etc., for works on the origin and history of these names and/or the rules, procedures, customs, etc., applied in selecting names for these types of entities. *Examples:*

Title: Anything but Rover : the art and science of naming your dog.
650 #0 \$a Dogs \$x Names.
650 #0 \$a Dog breeds.

Title: What's in the names of stars and constellations?
650 #0 \$a Stars \$x Names.
650 #0 \$a Constellations \$x Names.

Do not assign a heading of this type if a phrase heading has been established instead.
Example:

Street names [not Streets-Names]

2. -Names. (Continued)

b. Languages. In accordance with H 1154, assign the free-floating subdivision **-Etymology-Names** under individual languages and groups of languages for works on the origin and spelling of names in a particular language. If the work discusses a special category of names, assign headings to cover both the language or language group and the special topic. *Example:*

Title: Scottish field names.

650 #0 \$a Field names \$z Scotland.

650 #0 \$a English language \$x Etymology \$x Names.

651 #0 \$a Scotland \$x History, Local.
